FALMOUTH COMMODORES By Conner Peters, 2017 SEASON IN REVIEW \& Mike Murray


The Falmouth Commodores' 2017 season was truly a spectacular sight to behold for al the fans who attended games at Guv Fuller Field. The story actually began in 2016 when the beloved hometown team fell to the Y-D Red Sox two games to one in the Cape Cod Rall League Championship Series. The Commodores were saddened to see assistant coaches Brad Stoll and Jack Marde depart after years of hard work and dedication to the organization. With two positions Manager Jeff Trundy hired Kansas native Brett Becker as third base coach and 2009 Falmouth Commodore Hunter Morris to coach first base. Mike Landry the longstanding pitching coach did return for the 2017 season.
The 2017 season began slowly as the team started 0-3, and were playing only. 500 baseball by the end of the first month. But six straight wins to position themselves for a chance at winning the Western Division Regular Season Crown at the all-star break. Speaking of the All-Star game, the Western Division All-Stars were managed by Falmouth's own Jeff Trundy! Accompanying him were five of his players, chosen to represent
the Commodores and showcase their talent the Commodores and showcase their talent.
Those players were second baseman Clayton Daniel from Jacksonville State, shortstop

George Jancha from Texas A\&M, first baseman Alec Bohm from Wichita State, starting and relief pitcher Mitch Miller from Clemson. Throughout the 2017 season, the Commodores routinely showcased their ability to hit both for average and for power. In a collective effort, by the end of the season, the Dores ranked second in the league for overall batting average, batting .267 as an entire club. Leading the way were the
bats of Alec Bohm, Clayton Daniel, George Janca, and Josh Breaux, to name just a few. Alec Bohm ranked second in the league for batting average, logging 154 at-bats with an average of .351. Meanwhile, Marty Bechina finished second among Cape League home run leaders with 8 long balls. The Commodores' success at the plate translated into great offensive production, as the team tying the Brewster Whitecaps to lead the league. Combined with solid pitching from both the starters and the bullpen, the team quickly became a serious contender to win the Western Division.
As hoped, the Commodores did just that, finishing the season with a 24-19-1 record, and winning the Western Division Regular Season

GUV FULLER FIELD RECEIVES MAJOR GRANT TO REVITALIZE FIELD AND FACILITIES
On April 9, 2018, The Town of Falmouth Board of Selectmen approved a $\$ 477,815$ Community Preservation Act (CPA) grant at the request of the Falmouth Recreation Department and the
Falmouth Commodores to support much-needed improvements at Guv Fuller Field. This is the home field of the Commodores and the Falmouth High School Baseball team. The application process for this grant began last spring, was approved by the Community Preservation Committee (CPC) in November, and as a final step, was endorsed by the Town. There are several planned improvements including the installation of an electronic wheelchair lift within the newly renovated press box providing handicap
access to the 2nd floor. This will allow participation in the sports media internships offered by the Commodores and viewing of games from the new Crow's Nest observation deck. In addition, safety netting on steel poles will be installed along the home and visitors' sides of the field to protect spectators. The CCBL contributed $\$ 13,000$ towards the netting as a league-wide effort to improve safety at games. Other improvements include new state-of-the-art dugouts for both sides, bleachers on the visitors' side, a brick backstop, chain-link fencing, and new watkways will
be constructed. All construction will be compliant with Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements and will add not only significantly improved and safer facilities but will allow spectators with limited mobility to view the field from more areas. The Com modores "Grant Team" contributed significantly to the design of the project and submission of the grant. Implementation of the improvements will be shared by the Recreation Department and Works. The estimated completion date will be spring 2019 for all improvements.
